The forty-ninth year of camp began shortly after 9:00 A.M. in the parking lot of Braintree High School when Liam Harrington was the first camper to arrive for our week together. Liam was not alone for long. Within the hour he was joined by 375 campers... a staff

of 68... 3 trucks for luggage... and 9 yellow school buses. Shortly before 11:00 A.M. the trek to The Lake Ossipee Conference Center in Freedom, NH began. This is our 6th year at The Lake Ossipee Conference Center – a.k.a.: "Cody" or "Camp Cody."

This is our 49th year of camp. The first 25 years were spent at Camp Winni, followed by 18 years at Kingsmont, before moving to Cody in 2001. This is our largest camp ever... we have never exceeded 355 campers in the past.

Upon arrival at camp at 2:30 P.M. we were welcomed by our director, The Rev. Robert J. Ripley. "Rip" has only missed one of the 49 years of camp. After the brief welcome it was time to scatter to the cabins, claim bunks, and unload the luggage trucks. Everyone seemed to be relatively well settled by 4:00 P.M. when we gathered in the Council Ring for a welcome by the Camp Cody staff and a "rules briefing" by Don McGibbon, our assistant director. Don has been part of camp for 3 dozen years. Next on the agenda was dividing the camp into 35 Morning Groups. Morning Groups spend quality time together all week long.

Our week is off to a good start! It will be filled with fun and fellowship, with time for learning and time for fun, with laughter and songs and tears, with new friendships and perhaps a budding romance or two. We look forward to our week on the shore of Lake Ossipee.

THE CAMP CONGREGATIONS

Our camp week has been sponsored for 49 years by The South Shore Congregational Youth Conferences, a group of churches that work together to provide this opportunity for teens in grades 7 – 12. The churches are: The First Congregational Church of Braintree, Union Congregational Church, First Congregational Church of Weymouth, Bethany Congregational Church, and The Old South Union Church.

The 2006 Camp theme is THE GIVING TREE, based on the book by Shel Silverstein. Morning Groups will focus upon giving and receiving, needs and wants,



SPREE TIME

Several afternoons during the week feature SPREE TIME with a great variety of activities. Campers must

choose an activity since the one rule is – "You can not be in the cabins!" Spree Time offerings include: swimming, boating, volleyball, soccer, tennis, whiffle ball, space beads, crafts, sunbathing. Yoga, basketball, talent show, newspaper, and ultimate Frisbee. The canteen is also open during Spree Time and that is a major attraction for many of the campers.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TOURNAMENT

On Tuesday we began the afternoon program early at 2:15, allowing the first-ever "American National Elementary Athletic Tournament of America"



to run for almost three full hours. Despite the length, the program flew by amidst terrific enthusiasm from campers and counselors alike.
